FLU SHOT

Getting your flu shot helps save lives and helps our health care system by reducing the number of people who need medical care.

About the flu

- + The flu is very contagious and can spread quickly and easily.
- + Some people with the flu only get mildly ill. Others, like those over 65 years and young children, can get very sick.

Who should get the flu shot?

 Everyone 6 months and older should get the flu shot. It's especially important for people at high risk of health complications from the flu and COVID-19, and for people who can spread the flu to them.

The flu shot is safe

- + You can't get the flu from the flu shot.
- + Serious side effects from the flu shot are very rare.

The flu shot works

- + You should get the flu shot even if you've already had the COVID-19 vaccine. The COVID-19 vaccine doesn't protect you from the flu.
- Being protected from both the flu and COVID-19 lowers your risk of severe health complications.

Connecting with the CEO - In Case You Missed It

August 25, 2023

When it comes to technology, change is never easy. As we have all experienced at one time or another, upgrading the technology we use often presents its own set of challenges, a forced learning curve and often some moments of frustration along the way.

Recognizing this, I wanted to talk a bit this week about our hospital's recent move to Office 365.

As we continue the move towards full implementation of Office 365 which, ultimately, will include cloud-hosted e-mail and file sharing,



I know that some of you might be wondering why we made such a disruptive move when our previous email platform seemed to be working just fine. There are actually several reasons why this had to take place, and why it had to take place now.

In terms of timing, we were notified that all technical support for the Microsoft Exchange server which previously handled our email will end in 2025. As a result, all companies using this type of server have been left with no choice but to move to a cloud-based platform (Office 365) by that time.

Perhaps more importantly however, Office 365 features a variety of tools that can assist us in the prevention of and defence from cyber threats and attacks.

Now, more than ever, hospitals face real risks of having their technology compromised in a variety of ways. In fact, in April, a cyberattack at Cornwall Community Hospital caused delays to scheduled and non-urgent care along with HR and payroll systems, and in February of this year Ross Memorial Hospital in Lindsay experienced a ransomware attack that disabled some important diagnostic systems and access to medical files.

A hospital's risk from such attacks is now so great that Ontario Health has developed a Provincial Cyber Security Operating Model (CSOM) that consists of six Regional Security Operation Centers (RSCOC). All hospitals are required to align with the Provincial Cyber Security Operating Model by March 2024 and this province-wide structure will ensure that we are well-supported and have access to expert advice and hands-on assistance should the need arise.

Connecting with the CEO - In Case You Missed It (Continued)

One of our Must Do Can't Fail items, previously referred to as strategic initiatives, is digital transformation and this shift in technology is an important step in our path forward to becoming more digitized as an organization.

I would like to express my appreciation to our IT team for the work that they have been doing to get us set up on Office 365. I know it hasn't been easy and, to date, they have encountered a number of unexpected challenges and delays that have resulted in a lot of calls to our Helpdesk and additional collaboration with TOH.

I would also like to thank each and every one of you for your continued patience with this transition and other anticipated enhancements to come in terms of digital transformation. There are so many milestones yet to come which will help us make progress.

Going forward, the IT team will continue to offer Office 365 training opportunities. If anyone is interested in additional training or if you are having difficulties with the transition to Office 365, reach out to IT by calling extension 8000 or opening a ticket with the Helpdesk. As further changes take place, the information you need will be widely communicated.

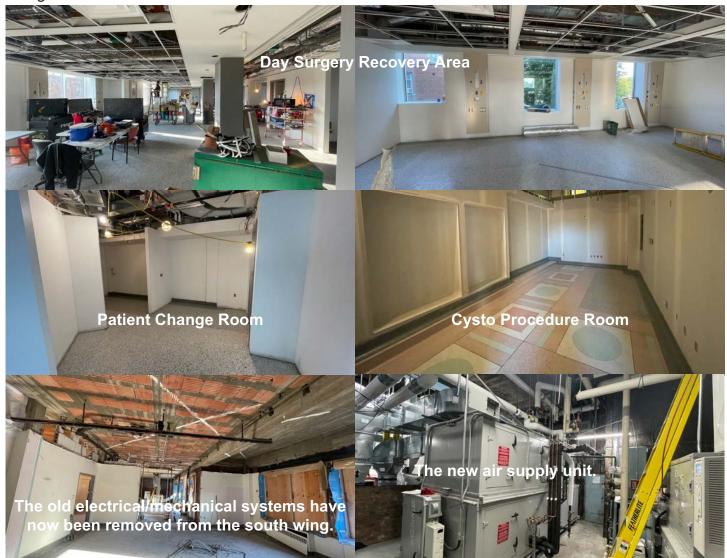

- Demolition of the south wing is just about complete allowing the Terrazzo flooring to get into full swing.

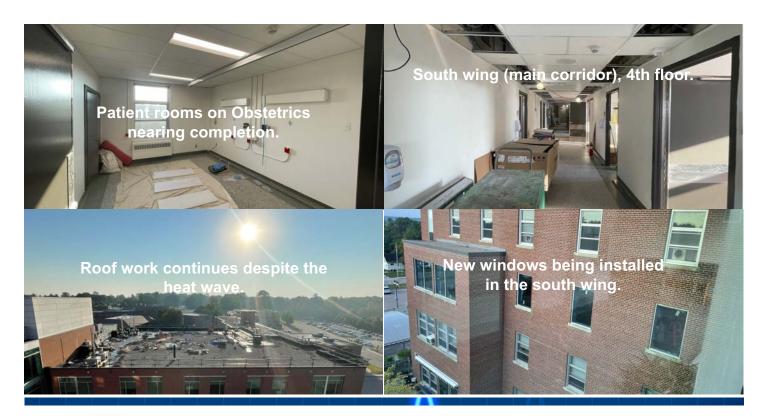


4th Floor Obstetrics

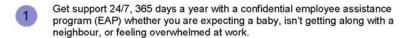

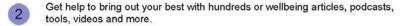

Just be sure to return everything when you are done so others can enjoy them.

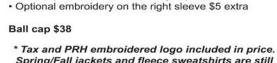
