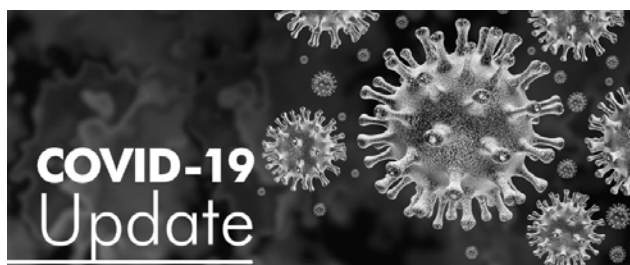

SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update #22

Today's Take-Aways:

- As part of our regular updates on the number of patients in our care who are probable and confirmed cases of COVID-19, here are today's numbers: eight probable COVID-19 cases on Medical 2A and one probable COVID-19 case in ICU; no confirmed COVID-19 cases at PRH.
- PPE challenges continue to be managed, including the current inventory of surgical/procedure masks. Please know that there is a lot of effort being made on this front at the regional and provincial levels to ensure there is long-term supply and that distribution is fair and equitable. Here is a current status of our priority PPE items:

- A new comprehensive document on Personal Protective Equipment for all staff and physicians was issued today. Please ensure that you read this document as it answers many of the questions on PPE that have recently been received.

- As you may have heard, the province is permitting licensed child care centres to open to provide emergency child care services for health care and other frontline staff. We have been advised by the County of Renfrew Child Care department that (at this time) two (2) licenced centres have applied to open and it is anticipated that up to five (5) spots will be available by mid-April. To secure a spot in one of these daycares, an online application will need to be submitted; we will pass on this information as soon as it becomes available.

We understand that the closure of schools and daycares has had a significant impact on staff with infants and school-aged children. We are mindful that juggling parental responsibilities and work is not easy at the best of times and we appreciate your managing your way through this and for finding creative solutions during this challenging time.

A reminder to staff that we have a “COVID-19 Assistance” bulletin board set up in the Tower B, 2nd floor staff corridor which has postings from older teenagers in our community offering to babysit. In addition, anyone experiencing difficulties in meeting child care obligations is encouraged to contact HR or their immediate supervisor.

- A good news story: Dr. Andreas Wielgosz has provided PRH Ambulatory clinics with additional clinic time for our heart failure patients. Dr. Wielgosz is coming to PRH and calling our patients for new consults and follow ups in order to keep these patients safe at home. The Heart Function Clinic's RNs are assisting in this process, as is our Telemedicine RPN. As a result we no longer have a wait list for heart failure patients. They are booked for an appointment by phone within a few weeks of their referral.

- Starting next week, this regular information update will change from a daily publication to one that is issued two to three times per week. In addition, the format will change to be more reader-friendly, with some added features like celebrations and shout-outs, photos and some short features about our staff, physicians and others doing outstanding things during challenging times.

- In Renfrew County there are still 12 laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 and one death to date. There have been 615 people tested, with 155 still under investigation. For the latest Renfrew County information on COVID-19, please visit www.rcdhu.com.

- In Ontario, there have been 5,759 laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 to date. There have been 200 deaths to date and 2,305 cases have been resolved. A total of 632 patients are hospitalized, 264 of those in ICU and 214 of those on ventilator. A total of 88,698 people have been tested and 1,208 remain under investigation.
