

Today's Take-Aways

• The Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre is receiving an average of 80-90 virtual visits per day. The calls received are revealing an increase in acuity of conditions suggesting that delays in accessing care are leading to deteriorating health conditions. This is being closely monitored and mitigation strategies are being explored.

• Consistent with messaging from other hospitals, our latest My Hospital Minute on myFM radio will have Dr. Tom Hurley speaking about the importance of visiting the emergency department for urgent medical situations, despite concerns about COVID-19. The messaging will reassure the community that the hospital is a safe place and that urgent medical care should not be delayed.

• Ontario Health has announced that all residents and staff working in long-term care and retirement homes will now require COVID-19 testing, even if asymptomatic. Public health units are being asked to prioritize homes for testing and to roll out testing sequentially in order not to overwhelm testing capacity or extend reporting times.

• Ontario Health has also reached out to hospitals for their assistance in safeguarding long-term care homes and retirement residences. In preparation for this, our Human Resources department will be surveying staff to see who might wish to volunteer to assist in these settings if necessary. This could include work as part of an infection prevention and control team, assisting with resident care or working in environmental services in the event of an outbreak. It has been confirmed that hospital staff assisting in this way will be able to work in both a long-term care/retirement residence setting and at PRH.

• In order to free up capacity in some of the busier Ottawa hospitals, hospitals outside of Ottawa are starting to receive some transfers of ALC (Alternate Level of Care) patients. The Ottawa hospitals are also planning to open new spaces for ALC patients in alternative settings such as hotels.

• New guidelines on how to manage health care workers and patients after they have been swabbed for COVID-19 have been issued. Our IPAC team has reviewed the new guidelines and created guidance material to assist in this process.

• There has been a small change in the procedure for universal masking. With the receipt of additional procedure masks, we will now be recalling expired N95 masks from areas where these were being used in place of procedure masks and replacing them with the newly acquired procedure masks.

• We are starting to see a small improvement in the supply of personal protective equipment which is allowing us to be able to work with other health care partners to share this supply where appropriate. In addition, approximately 10 to 15% of PPE donated by the public to us has been used to date. We are now exploring ways to share this supply with our regional distribution centre so that other health care partners can have access to it as required.

• MDR (Medical Device Reprocessing) is working on developing a Standard Work for the reprocessing of Salbutamol metred dose inhalers. With this in the works, there will also be a process put in place for the collection of Salbutamol inhalers beginning early next week.

• Our Communications working group is working with Mental Health Services and our Spiritual Care Coordinator, Garry Engler, to produce a number of videos for staff, the public and other health care partners to protect psychological wellbeing during the pandemic on topics such as stress management, work-life balance, anxiety, etc.

Up-To-Date Facts and Figures

• COVID-19 patients in our care: 6 probable on Medical 2A, 1 probable in the ED and 3 probable in ICU; no confirmed COVID-19 cases at PRH.

• In Renfrew County, for over a week, the number of laboratory confirmed cases has remained at 14 to date, and one death. To date, a total of 1,268 people have been tested, with 129 still under investigation. For the latest Renfrew County information on COVID-19, please visit <u>www.rcdhu.com</u>.
