

Today's Take-Aways

- PRH has established a Long-Term Care and Retirement Home Task Force to assist if called upon to do so by homes in need of support for infection prevention and control or as a result of an outbreak. This Task Force would oversee the creation of a team which could be deployed in short notice (24 to 48 hours) to a long-term care or retirement home with staff from occupational health, nursing, infection prevention and control, and management along with any necessary supplies. We are currently in the preparation and readiness stage as we have not been requested to help as of yet. Our work is well aligned with the approach in Ottawa where hospitals have already been asked to support certain long-term care homes.
- There is an ongoing review of the most appropriate admission destinations for COVID-19 positive and COVID-19 probable cases along with work being completed with paramedic services to align by-pass protocols and put in place standardized approaches across the Champlain region.
- Our Acute Care Working Group is working on standardized orders for palliative care. In addition, new provincial guidelines have been received for maternity patients who are COVID-19 positive or probable.
- We have recently seen an increase in the number of patients coming to our Emergency Department. This coincides with our recent messaging to the community to not hesitate to come to the ED if they need care and that our ED is a safe environment in which to receive care.
- PRH is still waiting on additional guidance on the new health care worker premium. The premium will be rolled out once this additional guidance has been issued by the province.
- The staff screening tool has been updated to include a question on whether anyone in an individual's household has symptoms of COVID-19 or has been swabbed for COVID-19. Please note that you will be asked this additional as part of the daily screening.
- The Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre has now extended its service to residents of South Algonquin (i.e. the Whitney/Madawaska area near Algonquin Park which lies just outside of Renfrew County in the District of Nipissing).
- The Communication working group is working towards the launch of an enhanced recognition program to celebrate staff and express gratitude for the work that is being done at PRH. The program will initially apply to the current COVID-19 challenges but will also lay the groundwork for enhanced recognition into the future.



- COVID-19 patients in our care: 1 probable in ICU, 2 probable on Medical 2A, and 1 probable on AMH; no confirmed COVID-19 cases at PRH.
- In Renfrew County, there have now been 17 laboratory confirmed cases to date, and one death. To date, a total of 1,866 people have been tested, with 100 still under investigation. For the latest Renfrew County information on COVID-19, please visit www.rcdhu.com.



A Call to Action: Essential Service Workers




