

Today's Take-Aways

• As we wait for further provincial and regional direction about the ramp up of elective surgeries, scheduled outpatient procedures, diagnostic tests and ambulatory clinic visits, there is lots of work to be done. This includes the creation of a dashboard tracking system for the weekly assessment of availability of human resources, personal protective equipment and beds. This dashboard will become part of our framework and recovery plan as we move forward.

• This past Friday, updated versions of a *Special Edition PPE Guide and Universal Masking* documents which reflect current practice were circulated to all staff and physicians and are currently available on the Staff Resources section of our hospital's website. Changes within both documents were highlighted.

• Phase 2 of Universal Masking has now been successfully implemented at Pembroke Regional Hospital. Thanks and congratulations to Kirsten Johnson and her team of champions for their exceptional efforts in putting this in place.

• We currently have staff deployed to two retirement homes in our region and our hospital has received positive feedback from the homes on this partnership. Thanks to all staff who have volunteered to assist in long-term care and retirement home settings. All long-term care and retirement homes in our region continue to be in good shape with no outbreaks and it is anticipated that all assessments and swabbing of residents and staff will be wrapped up this week.

• Mental Health Services of Renfrew County (MHSRC) has received a new guidance document: *COVID-19 Guidance: Mental Health and Addiction Service Providers in Community Settings* which includes information on PPE use, home visit structure, etc. MHSRC is also anticipating new guidelines on patient flow and will be reviewing this with staff for rollout.

• The Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre is in the process of examining aspects of their service which may have post-COVID application. One of their findings to date is the great benefit the service has had on a large number of unattached patients who have been able to connect with a primary care giver, particularly those in the Pembroke and Petawawa areas.

• Information Technology has reported that since the launch of electronic staff screening on April 29th it has been used a total of 538 times. Staff and physicians are encouraged to use the screening tool which can be found on the Staff Resources section of the PRH website in order to save a bit of time when entering the facility at the start of their shift.

• In non-COVID-19 news, Medical Device Reprocessing (MDR) has received new machinery to reprocess urology equipment. We have also received new urology and GI scopes, drying cabinets and washing equipment. This equipment will enable PRH to continue the delivery of safe, efficient, and high quality care to our patients. Training and education for staff is in the planning phase.
