

Today's Take-Aways

Regional Updates

• Patient flow and repatriation processes are currently under review at the regional level.

• Renfrew County hospitals have all adopted the same principles for the Visitor Policy. There is ongoing discussion about how it aligns at the regional level and how it differs from the one at The Ottawa Hospital and others in the region. The policy is reviewed regularly and will be updated when needed.

• Primary care physicians are reporting substantial increases in the number of patients being seen either in-person or virtually.

• At both a regional and local level, there is lots of ongoing discussion about waiting room challenges and how to manage increased volume while maintaining physical distancing.

Human Resources

• Along with this week's COVID-19 update, we are attaching by email a series of documents with further detail on the distribution of Pandemic Pay by the province. Any questions around Pandemic Pay or these documents should be directed to covid19questions@prh.email.

• A small number of PRH staff are still deployed to Riverview Heights until the end of July at which point we will enter into a service agreement with the residence to provide RPN support in the amount of 12-16 shifts per month. Marianhill also continues to experience staffing challenges.

PPE Status

• Our PPE supplies have significantly stabilized across the region. Some challenges remain for specific items. Please see the status report in this week's update for more details.

• Materials Management is in the process of transitioning PPE distribution from A517 to the warehouse.

Clinical News

• Our hospital is currently over-capacity in terms of the number of admitted patients in our care. An increased number of surgical cases and higher than normal number of ALC (Alternate Level of Care) patients are contributing to this situation. As a result, a new working group has been formed to look at surgical capacity and make adjustments as required.

• As we continue to ramp up services, waiting room space has become a challenge. We are now exploring various innovative ways to ensure physical distancing while managing higher patient volumes. This could include improved configuration, and furnishings, introduction of a pager or texting system, and enhanced cleaning practices. In the meantime, we will be reducing the space between seating and providing those in the ED waiting area with medical grade masks.

We are also asking all departments to review how their waiting areas are used using the principle that no one should need to be in waiting areas and rooms if there are alternatives.

• Please note that our COVID champions will no longer be rounding the units or attending huddles/ meetings. Most of these educators have now resumed their previous roles. If you require assistance with COVID related concerns, please connect with the Infection Control Team or Kirsten Johnson in order to get the support that is required.

• Our clinical services continue to ramp up. Here is a summary of some of the latest developments:

Diagnostic Imaging - continues to ramp up all services while maintaining safe social distances, and is currently operating at 81% of normal capacity. The department anticipates seeing increased volume as primary care visits increase.

Emergency Department – is now operating at approximately 70-80% of its pre-COVID volume and is experiencing an increased number of required admissions.

A number of our clinical departments (Rehabilitation, Medical, Surgical, OR/MDR) are all experiencing added pressures due to the number of ALC patients in the building and some staffing challenges.

Ambulatory Clinics – is now operating at approximately 85% of capacity. In order to address space challenges, patients continue to be asked to attend appointments alone where possible.

• Hot menu items are slowly being reintroduced in The Lunch Box. The special on July 28th will be a sweet and sour meatball combo. Our chefs are also adding more spice and flavourings to our grab and go sandwich options.

Rehab Deck Project: All the pink insulation on the roof has been removed. The drains were cleaned out using high pressure water. The rubber membrane was inspected and patched in some areas with a Blueskin waterproofing membrane product. The rain has been an ongoing concern and challenge while we keep up with new leaks in the Outpatient Rehabilitation area. Work has started in prepping the perimeter along the walls to receive material for sloping the water away from the building.
