

Today's Take-Aways

Provincial Updates

• There are currently 40 COVID positive patients in ICUs province-wide, five of those are within our region. The first paediatric patient requiring hospitalization in Ontario is at CHEO.

• Ontario Health continues to explore the viability of reprocessing N95 masks.

Regional Updates

• With higher demand for paediatric swabbing anticipated as schools open up, processes are being put in place by Public Health and EMS with training from CHEO to look at doing in-house swabbing where possible. CHEO is also creating a training video which will be available to hospitals for those circumstances where paediatric swabbing needs to be done in the ED.

Human Resources

• Unless different direction is received from the province, Pandemic Pay for the first two reporting periods will be issued to eligible staff on August 21st.

• PRH staff are no longer deployed to Riverview Heights, however an agreement remains in place which enables them to request assistance as required.

• Environmental Services is increasing staffing to address the need for additional and more frequent cleanings in waiting rooms and other high traffic areas.

Clinical News

• To ensure that we're following a consistent and regional approach to PPE, universal eye protection is being rolled out in our Ambulatory Clinics. This change is also being prompted by the cases we are now seeing within our community and the increased prevalence of COVID-19 within the Ottawa area.

• An organization-wide assessment of waiting areas is ongoing in order to determine how to safely distance those waiting in existing space. This includes looking at ways to modify the current furniture configurations as well as exploring options for new furnishings that may have a smaller footprint. Together with other hospitals, we are exploring innovative alternatives to traditional waiting rooms.

• At PRH and regionally, patient day passes have not yet been reintroduced. Instead, where possible, outdoor visits with family members are being arranged.

• Our clinical services continue to ramp up. Here are the latest developments:

Diagnostic Imaging – The department has reached approximately 85% capacity and is likely to maintain this volume for a while.

Ambulatory Clinics – This area of service has also reached approximately 85% capacity and is also expected to level off at this volume for the foreseeable future.

Today's Take Aways...Continued From Front

Emergency Department - While the overall number of visits has been a bit lower than usual, the number of patients requiring admission is increasing.

OR/Surgical – Only two ORs are in service this week and next week as part of a planned summer slowdown.

AMH – Form 1 hospitals have resumed admission of voluntary patients which is expected to take some pressure off our inpatient unit.

Medical – Bed occupancy by ALC patients continues to be an issue throughout the region. Due to a high volume of patients being swab tested for COVID, the west wing on 2A has been redesignated as a COVID unit.

• A number of areas including Zone B, parts of Diagnostic Imaging, parts of Outpatient Rehab, and the Cardiac corridor have been impacted by flooding as a result of rain water sitting on the Rehab deck/roof that is being reconstructed.
